

Technical Requirement for Environmental Products

The Certificable Technical Requirement for Environmental Labelling Products

HJBZ 5—2000

Products Made from Recycled Paper

Replace HJBZ 5—1994

1 Scope

This technical requirement specifies the basic requirements, technical contents and test method of environmental labelling products made from recycled paper.

This technical requirement shall apply to recycled paper made from waste paper as well as decorating and constructional material which made from main raw material of waste paper.

2 Basic requirements

2.1 Quality of products shall conform with requirement of relevant product quality standard.

2.2 Pollutant emission of the company should be obliged to conform with pollutant emission standards nationally or locally.

3 Technical contents

3.1 Recycled paper

3.1.1 Newspaper, commercial paper (such as packing paper and board paper), cultural paper (such as exercise book paper, envelope paper, printed matter), living paper (such as toilet paper, paper washcloth) must be manufactured by 100% waste paper, fresh paper pulp should be no more than 5% (by weight) at most.

3.1.2 The products must be declared that they cannot be used for food package and disposable surgery paper.

3.2 Wallpaper and baseboard made from waste paper: wastepaper content in wallpaper should not be less than 60% (by weight); and wastepaper content in baseboard should not be less than 80% (by weight).

3.3 Constructional material manufactured by waste paper: for constructional material for isolation (for example, sound insulation and heat insulation) made from waste paper, wastepaper content should not be less than 80% (by weight).

4 Test

4.1 Technical contents shall be verified by the way of checking instruction of the products on field inspection.

4.2 The contents of basic requirements shall be verified through field inspection.
